

FAQs: OECD CORPORATE INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

1. I am a student at the Faculty of Mathematics and Physics, University of Ljubljana. Can I apply for the internship programme?

The call for the OECD corporate internship programme is published on the basis of an agreement signed between OECD and the Faculty of Economics, University of Ljubljana (FELU). The main eligibility criterion is that you are a full-time student of the FELU.

2. Can I apply directly to the OECD for the internship?

A call for the OECD Internship Programme is released based on the Corporate Internship Agreement between the OECD and FELU. Only candidates pre-selected by FELU and recommended to the OECD can apply for the Internship Programme.

3. How does the whole process, from application to selection, look like?

- 1 - FELU opens a call for the OECD Internship Programme based on the OECD invitation
- 2 - Students apply to FELU, sending all the requested documents
- 3 - FELU pre-selects students for the internship, informs and invites them to fill-out an online application
- 4 - OECD carries out screening of applicants
- 5 - Potential candidates selected by OECD are called to complete a written test
- 6 - Successful candidates have a 45-60 minute panel interview (via Skype or personally)
- 7 - If selected, candidates are called with an offer from OECD

4. How is the beginning and duration of the internship determined in case a student is selected?

Among pre-selected students OECD chooses and contacts suitable candidates. After a successful interview the student and the OECD representative determine the date and the duration of the internship and other formalities.

5. How many places/vacancies are available?

Number of students FELU recommends to OECD varies from call to call. The number of students selected for the internship at the OECD depends on the OECD itself and their needs at a particular time.

6. In case I am selected for the internship will I receive any payment to cover travel costs and accommodation?

FELU is involved only at the initial stage of selecting students and recommending them to OECD thus we cannot give any official information about financial arrangements between a student and OECD. To our knowledge students which have been selected for the internship in the past did not receive remuneration, fee or allowance however OECD gave them a small monthly contribution to cover basic living expenses.
